• Tuesday, May 18, 1943

- Anne witnesses an air battle between German and British planes. The Allied soldiers (British) have to parachute out of their burning plane.
- The Secret Annex crew has to burn their garbage every day rather than put it in a trash can, since they don't want office workers who don't know about them to find out.
- The young people of Holland are all being forced to join the Germans or do hard labor in Germany. Anne wonders what will become of Holland.
- The guns are loud and terrifying at night. Mrs. van Daan is terrified, and, since her husband doesn't comfort her well enough, she goes to sleep with Mr. Dussel (!).
- o Anne finds this so hysterical that the guns don't bother her anymore that night.

Sunday, June 13, 1943

- Anne turns fourteen and receives a birthday poem from Pim (her nickname for her father).
- The poem is in the diary and it's very sweet. Basically her dad acknowledges that they've all been a nagging pain to Anne and asks her to please put up with them.
 The poem shows that he sees what's going on with her pretty well.
- Anne also gets a big fat Greek and Roman mythology book, which she's psyched about.

• Tuesday, June 15, 1943

- One of the protectors, Mr. Voskuijl, has terminal cancer. Everyone in the Secret Annex misses him.
- Everybody in Holland has to turn in their radios to the officials. The Annex group, however, is getting a secret small one. People all throughout the country are trying to get hold of old radios that they can turn in while secretly keeping another one on hand. Without a radio, they can't access British war news and will only hear German propaganda.

Sunday, July 11, 1943

- Anne continues to get criticized for being a bad kid. She's trying to keep herself from telling everyone what she thinks of them, and is trying to use humor to deal with the constant scolding.
- Anne decides to let her shorthand go for a little while. Her eyes have gotten really bad, but it is impossible to find a safe way to get glasses.
- The family is thinking of getting one of the protectors to take Anne to see an eye doctor. The decision hasn't been made yet, though.
- Anne and Margot begin to help Miep with office work like filing.

• Tuesday, July 13, 1943

- Anne tries to reason with Mr. Dussel to allow her to use the table in their room two afternoons a week, so that she can get some of her work done. Mr. Dussel scoffs at her, suggesting that her "work" in mythology is not real work at all.
- Pim goes to bat for Anne and asks Mr. Dussel to reconsider. Mr. Dussel finally gives in.

• Friday, July 16, 1943

 Burglars again in the office, only this time for real. They steal blank checks, cashboxes, and the Secret Annex's ration coupons for 330 pounds of sugar.

Monday, July 19, 1943

o North Amsterdam is heavily bombed and lies in ruins. Hundreds were killed.

• Friday, July 23, 1943

- Anne describes the first thing each person wants when they get out of the Secret Annex:
- Mr. and Mrs. van Daan: a hot bath.
- Mr. Dussel: to see his girlfriend.
- Mrs. Frank: a cup of real coffee.
- Mr. Frank: to see Mr. Voskuijl (the nice guy who is dying of cancer).

- Peter: to go downtown.
- Anne: for her family to have a home of their own again so she can move about freely.

Monday, July 26, 1943

Bombs fall nearby, frightening everybody.

Thursday, July 29, 1943

- Anne groans over Mr. Dussel and Mrs. van Daan, who have been criticizing her and her "upbringing" again.
- Anne goes off (in writing), criticizing "Madame" van Daan for two pretty long paragraphs.

Tuesday, August 3, 1943

- More air raids. The Italians are fighting the Fascists now.
- The cats bring fleas inside the Secret Annex and everybody suffers.

• Wednesday, August 4, 1943

- Anne describes a "typical" evening and night in the Secret Annex: getting ready for bed at 9 p.m., everyone waiting to use the sink, saying goodnights, Mr.
 Dussel loudly shuffling around, etc.
- o Anne writes a description of Mr. Dussel's night sounds, which isn't pretty.

• Thursday, August 5, 1943

 Anne describes a "typical" day in the Secret Annex up to mid-afternoon: once it's lunch time in the office below, the Secret Annex can relax a bit, listen to the radio, distribute food, etc.

Saturday, August 7, 1943

Anne is writing some fiction. Not many details.

Monday, August 9, 1943

- Anne is running out of things to write about.
- She now describes a "typical" day from mid-afternoon through the evening meal:
 Mr. van Daan getting served first, Mrs. van Daan giving everyone advice, Peter being quiet, Mr. Dussel hogging all of the food.

Tuesday, August 10, 1943

 Anne decides to keep her opinions to herself during meals, which everyone seems to appreciate.

- The Westertoren clock's bells have been taken away. They'll be melted down for some purpose in the war. No one knows what time of day it is anymore.
- Anne gets new shoes (high heels), which everyone admires.
- Anne does a bunch of clumsy things and ends up with a hurt finger, hurt toe, and bump on her head.
- Mr. Dussel endangers everybody's lives by getting Miep to bring him a forbidden (anti-Mussolini) book.
- Anne writes about potato peeling: how Mr. Dussel does it badly but lectures her on how to do it like him; how Mrs. van Daan tries to flirt with Mr. Dussel while peeling potatoes. This part is pretty funny—be sure to check it out.
- Anne writes about "freedom in the Annex": Bep shows up at 5 p.m. to let them know the office workers are gone, so they can wander around the office and warehouse.

• Monday, August 23, 1943

- Anne describes the early morning, before breakfast, which seems to be the only time the Franks have a bit of real family time.
- At 8:30am they have to stop using water, flushing the toilet, and making noise because the office workers start showing up.
- The Franks settle in to reading, knitting, and having quiet family time.

• Friday, September 10, 1943

- o Italy capitulates (that's a crazy word for surrendering).
- Mr. Kleiman goes to the hospital for an abdominal operation.

• Thursday, September 16, 1943

- Everyone is so touchy and interactions are so tense that nobody talks at mealtimes.
- Anne feels depressed and takes valerian to try to fight it.
- The warehouseman, Mr. Maaren, is becoming suspicious of the Secret Annex.
 Everyone, including the protectors, is acting extra cautious.

• Wednesday, September 29, 1943

- It is Mrs. van Daan's birthday and she gets some food rations, but really nothing very exciting.
- Bep has a fit of nerves. So many of the other "protectors" are sick that most of the care and errands for the Secret Annex folks is up to her. She is doing too much work.

- Mr. Dussel is all fussy because he thinks everyone is treating him badly. Mrs.
 Frank tells him that he has been a disappointment and the cause of a lot of trouble. Anne thinks the man hasn't done anything to merit being liked.
- Pim and Mr. van Daan are at odds again because the van Daans have been holding back food and acting sneakily.

• Sunday, October 17, 1943

 Mr. van Daan has run out of money but Mrs. van Daan doesn't want to sell any of her nice, valuable clothes. She thinks that the company (the office that they're living in) should pay for everything they need, which everyone but her thinks is ridiculous.

• Friday, October 29, 1943

- The van Daans have been unable to get money by selling clothes because they're asking too high a price. They finally sell one of Mrs. van Daans furs, but she wants to keep the money to buy some clothes after the war. This lady is hard to understand.
- The van Daans have a raging fight.
- Anne has lost her appetite and is feeling generally awful and oppressed by the Secret Annex and its inhabitants.

Saturday, October 30, 1943

- Anne feels sad because her parents always side with Margot during disagreements. She's also jealous of her father's affection for Margot—but she says she isn't jealous of Margot. Really she just wants to trust that her father loves her for who she is.
- Anne has an even harder time with her mother. She thinks Mrs. Frank doesn't act like a mom. Anne feels like she has to mother herself.
- Anne believes that she has no good role models and that her parents have let her down.

• Wednesday, November 3, 1943

- Mr. Frank wants to give Anne a Bible to continue her education. It's rather awkward when everybody realizes he meant to give it to her on Hanukkah; then he says, er, well, St. Nicholas Day might be a better day to give that gift.
- The group is beginning to be careless, according to Anne. They're lighting a fire during hours when neighbors can see the smoke and opening the curtains occasionally. Everyone fights about these occurrences.

Monday evening, November 8, 1943

- Anne says that she's feeling depressed. She's easily terrified.
- A ring at the door while Bep is there reminds Anne once again of the constant danger they live in.
- o In bed at night, Anne imagines the Secret Annex burning, or being alone in a jail.

• Thursday, November 11, 1943

 Anne eulogizes the life of her fountain pen, which was accidentally burned in the fire.

• Wednesday, November 17, 1943

- The protectors are still either sick or frantically busy.
- o Mr. Dussel is giving the van Daans the silent treatment for no apparent reason.
- Mr. Dussel has also been in the Annex for one year. He does not thank the rest of the members for unselfishly taking him in. Anne has absolutely no respect for the man.

Saturday, November 27, 1943

- Anne dreams about her old school friend, Lies Hanneli, and feels terribly guilty that she is safe and her friend, in the dream, is suffering.
- Anne asks God to help Lies. She feels very tortured about her friend in this entry.

Monday, December 6, 1943

Anne celebrates St. Nicholas Day by giving each person a poem.

• Wednesday, December 22, 1943

Anne is sick with flu and everybody receives extra food items for Christmas.

Friday, December 24, 1943

 Anne had the flu (she's better now). Anne recalls that everyone tried to administer their own cures to her, but the worst was Mr. Dussel putting his head on Anne's chest to check her heart. This horrified and embarrassed her. It's a pretty funny story, though, the ways she tells it.
